Tennis Facilities – Policies and Procedures

Coronavirus may be present, Enter at your own risk

Court Access

Only residents in good standing (current w/ HOA dues or current on an approved payment plan) with an access card with your picture on it are allowed to use the tennis courts. The access card you received will grant access to the courts through the tennis court gate. Do not hold the door or permit entry by anyone who does not have an active card. Non-residents are not allowed to use the courts at any time, unless they are guests of a resident in good standing. Under no circumstances can guests use the tennis courts without the host resident being present at all times.

Hours of Operation

The courts are open during the same time as the pool is open. Please refer to the fairmontonthepark.com website if you are unsure of the times since they may change through this summer of Covid-19. The main timer will shut off the lights 15 minutes after closing time.

Tennis Courts Etiquette and Conduct

The courts are to be used for tennis only. No skateboards, rollerblades, bikes, scooters, or any other wheeled device is allowed since it will damage the surface. Appropriate attire should be worn while on court, including proper footwear without black soles to prevent streaks and marking the surface.

Please turn off the court lights when play is complete. This will cut down on the power bill to run the lights.

Please put all trash in the trash cans located on the net posts. If the cans are full, please empty them in the dumpsters behind the clubhouse when done.

It is expected that all players will conduct themselves in a civilized manner. Use of profanity will not be tolerated.

Due to Covid-19 & the requirement of physical distancing the following will apply

1. DO NOT ENTER the tennis court area if you or anyone in your household is experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 (fever, cough, shortness of breath, chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell)
2. Please use hand sanitizer that you provide prior to entering the tennis court area.
3. Please disinfect all equipment that is shared before and after use.
4. Please mark your tennis balls so you can distinguish them from others.
5. Do not handle any tennis balls that are not yours – use your feet or racquet to send tennis balls back to the person they belong to in order to stay safe.
6. Do not switch sides while playing or either switch by passing on opposite ends of the net.
7. If playing doubles, maintain at least 6 feet of distance between anyone that is not of the same household as yourself.
